Note from the Acting Editor: the following article describes a concert for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and it was, of course, submitted before Queen Elizabeth II passed away on 8th September 2022. It is a fitting tribute to Her Majesty's long reign.

Musical Snapshots from the Life and Reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. St Mary and St Michael Church, Egremont on Friday 3rd June 2022.

The Egremont Town Band opened up our celebrations with the National Anthem and set off the first half of the programme with RULE BRITANNIA. James Thomson's 1740 poem Rule Britannia was set to music by Thomas Arne in the same year.

JERUSALEM

"And did those feet in ancient time" is a poem by William Blake printed c. 1808. Today it is best known as the hymn Jerusalem with music written by Sir Hubert Parry in 1916. The WI members first sang "Jerusalem" in 1924. The Queen started to attend WI meetings in 1943, and remained involved with the Sandringham WI.

CRIMOND

Was the band's next piece; the Queen had two honorary degrees in music, a Bachelor of Music from the University of London, and a Doctor of Music from the University of Wales. Both were awarded before she ascended the throne.

ISLE OF INNISFREE

Music from the time of Queen Elizabeth's Accession to the throne. The "ISLE OF INNISFREE" was composed by Richard Farrelly who wrote both the music and lyrics.

JUPITER THEME

I Vow to thee my Country - Queen Elizabeth II committed herself to her country and the commonwealth at her Coronation.

RAF MARCHPAST

RAF Regimental March. On 29 July 1977 it was part of the Silver Jubilee celebrations, played at Royal Review of the Royal Air Force, RAF Finningley.

THE BEST OF BOND

During her Diamond Jubilee year in 2012, Queen Elizabeth played her own part for the Palace scenes of the Olympic Opening Ceremony film with Daniel Craig, the James Bond actor. Her corgis also featured. A medley: From Russia with Love, Goldfinger, You Only Live Twice and The James Bond Theme.

HIGHLAND CATHEDRAL

The Queen's Scottish retreat was Balmoral. This piece was written by two Germans - Michael Korb and Ulrich Raever in 1982 for Bagpipes.

HEART OF OAK

Then came our joint piece, Egremont Town Band and Tantony Ringers. The Band leader Paul and our leader Jane, thought it would be good to try playing a joint piece together, but the music for a full brass and 12 bell handbell team doesn't exist. Heart of Oak has been especially arranged by Jane. It went well considering a few of us were a bit nervous.

Then it was our turn to do our pieces. Tantony Ringers have had to regroup since restarting after Covid as our numbers have shrunk, with less people we have been forced to start learning a whole new repertoire for a smaller set of just 12 bells.

The first tune was Trumpet Tune - Played at the Coronation, it was originally attributed to Henry Purcell but subsequently recognised as composed by Jeremiah Clarke.

ROYAL FIREWORKS MUSICK MINUET NO 2.

Commissioned by King George II and performed on 27th April 1749 in Green Park, London.

WHERE IS YOUR HEART?

From Moulin Rouge, a popular song written in 1952 also known as "It's April Again" first appeared in the 1952 film Moulin Rouge. The only UK hit version was recorded by Mantovani and his Orchestra on 6th March 1953.

GREENSLEEVES

Was played at the Coronation. Ralph Vaughan Williams wrote Fantasia on Greensleeves in 1934, adopted for Sir John in Love and arranged by Ralph Greaves for strings and harp with optional flute(s).

THE BRITISH GRENADIERS

For the Army; the Quick March of the Royal Regiment of Fusiliers and several other regiments including the Royal Engineers. Having been evacuated to Windsor Castle on the morning of her 16th birthday in 1942, Princess Elizabeth undertook her first inspection of a military regiment during a parade. She had been given the role of Honorary Colonel of the Grenadier Guards.

Then Tantony and the band had a break. We were given a fine rendition by Paul the band leader, who played Wedding March (Mendelssohn). It was stunning to say the least. The Queen was Patron to the Royal College of Organists.

COUNTRY AIRS (INCLUDING JOHN PEEL AND ENGLISH COUNTRY GARDEN). John Peel - Quick March of Queen's Own Yeomanry, an Army Reserve light armoured reconnaissance regiment. John Peel had hunting hounds, which are not the same as corgis, but they are both types of dogs! Queen Elizabeth's interest in horses is legendary: attending races, breeding and owning horses and riding. The piece also made us think of many trees she planted to mark special occasions and the Garden Parties she hosted for ordinary people across the country.

O LITTLE TOWN OF BETHLEHEM.

A tradition begun in 1932 by King George V, confirmed by the Queen's father King George VI and then Queen Elizabeth from 1952, the Royal Christmas Message broadcasts have become part of Christmas for many people. In 2011 Queen Elizabeth quoted the last verse of O Little Town of Bethlehem in her Christmas Message:

"O Holy Child of Bethlehem, Descend to us we pray. Cast out our sin and enter in Be born in us today."

IN THE BLEAK MID-WINTER

Handbells are most often associated with Christmas, so we played an arrangement of another Christmas carol quoted by the Queen in her Christmas Broadcast of 2012: "What can I give him, poor as I am?

If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb;

If I were a wise man, I would do my part,

Yet what I can I give him? Give my heart".

These are reminders of the Queen's Christian commitment: her own faith and her role as the Supreme Governor of The Church of England.

AIR FROM WATER MUSIC.

Composed by Handel following a request by King George I for a concert on the Thames on 17th July 1717. There was a River Thames pageant for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee on

3rd June 2012. Handel's Water Music was performed by The Academy of Ancient Music as they travelled down the Thames on a barge.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY.

Queen Elizabeth's Birthday is 21st April but she celebrated publicly on her Official Birthday, usually on 2nd Saturday in June (established by King George VI, in the hope of better weather than on his real birthday of 14th December). It is marked by Trooping the Colour and Balcony appearances. This year the Queen's Official Birthday was moved to the Bank Holiday on 2nd June 2022 (the date of her coronation in 1953).

POMP AND CIRCUMSTANCE. TRIO FROM MARCH NO. 4.

Written before World War I, on the naive assumption of a splendid show of military pageantry, "Pomp" has no connection with the drabness and terror, ie the "Circumstance" of actual warfare. March No. 4 is as upbeat and ceremonial as No. 1, and was completed on 7th June 1907, and dedicated by Elgar "To my friend Dr G Robertson Sinclair, Hereford". It was first performed on 24th August 1907, in the Queen's Hall, London, conducted by the composer. Elgar used the tune from the Trio to set his wife's words to music in a song called "The King's Way", in celebration of the opening of Kingsway, London in 1909. During World War II, No. 4 also acquired words: a patriotic poem by A. P. Herbert with the refrain beginning "All men must be free". At end of the Coronation, March No 4 was played.

There we ended our concert: Thank you, Jane and Paul, for all your hard work. We played jointly with the band - Hearts of Oak was a difficult piece, but we started together and finished together!!

Thank you to the Reverend Richard Lee for announcing all the programmes. Thank you also to Gordon for the Jubilee decorations, a nice finishing touch.

TANTONY RINGERS

HRGB NORTH WEST REGION

Draft Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on Saturday, 7th May 2022 at The Centre @ Halton, Low Road, Halton, Near Lancaster, LA2 6NB, commencing at 12.20 pm.

Present: Independent Member Linda Parkington and representatives of the following teams: Dean HR, Greystoke HR, Kinder Ringers, Maghull Parish HR, Marron Valley HR, Tantony Ringers.

The Meeting was chaired by Linda Parkington (Regional Chair), who began by welcoming everyone.

- 1. Apologies for Absence were received from Sue Ardern (Marple URC HR), Alan Cox (Kirkby Lonsdale HR), Jane Holland (Tantony HR), Jill Roberts (Gresford HR) and Kate Worthington (Sale HR).
- 2. Draft Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 22nd May 2021, which had been circulated to all Members, were approved as a correct record and signed by the Chair.
- **3. Correspondence**: No correspondence relating to the Annual General Meeting had been received.
- 4. Chair's Report for the past year had been circulated to all members. Linda Parkington reported that Covid had continued to have a major effect on the Region's activities, but we managed to arrange an online workshop in July, led by Beth McCord, and by the autumn things were beginning to ease, so we staged two carefully organized face to face events, at Newbiggin in October and at Reddish in November. Both were well attended and members thoroughly enjoyed this first opportunity to meet together and socialize. As well as thanking the Committee and everyone else who has worked for the benefit of the Region, Linda ended with an appeal for members to consider becoming more involved through the Committee. Her Report was accepted.
- 5. Secretary's Report for the past year this had also been circulated to all members. Irene Merson reported that the Committee had used Zoom for its first two meetings in 2021, but had managed to have two face to face meetings in August and October, the latter in our pre-Covid meeting place at Halton. One change the Committee brought about was to discontinue Sales in the region the demand had been steadily diminishing over the years,

and as the online HRGB Sales was now providing an excellent service, it was decided to refer members to that. The Report was accepted.

6. Presentation of Accounts for the year ended 31st December 2021 – the examined Accounts had been circulated to all members before the Meeting and were passed unanimously. The Treasurer, Anne Hopley, was thanked for her work in preparing them.

Representative to the National Executive Committee: Margaret Hubbard, who had served as the Region's representative for many years, had indicated her intention to stand down, and was warmly thanked for her work on behalf of the Region. No postal nominations had been received, so it was agreed that the matter should be referred to the North West Committee, with a view to filling this important vacancy as soon as possible.

Junior Committee Member – as no nominations had been received, Beth McCord agreed to continue in the role of Junior Liaison.

Examiner of Accounts – Andrew Wise had agreed to continue as the Region's Examiner of Accounts and this was approved unanimously.

8. Regional, National and International Events – It was noted that the North West Region was due to host the National Rally in 2026; however, this was the year in which HRGB would be hosting the International Symposium in the UK. It was agreed that the NEC should be asked to indicate whether they would want the Region to host a National Rally in the usual format, during that year.

In 2022, UK Bronze would be held in October and the International Symposium would take place in Tennessee in August.

- **10.** Date and Venue of the 2023 AGM it was agreed that this should be decided by the Committee and details published to members in due course.

MUSIC IN MEMORY OF DEREK JACKSON

As you know, Derek passed away in December 2020, and a tribute to him was published soon afterwards. In view of all his work for the Region, and particularly for young ringers, the Committee wanted to produce a lasting memorial, and so we commissioned a piece of music in Derek's honour. We chose "Finlandia", one of his favourite pieces of music, and asked Malcolm Wilson to create a special arrangement. This will be rung for the first time as a massed ringing piece at the Spring GatheRing in March 2023. It will be sent out beforehand to those teams and independent members who book to attend this event, and made available afterwards to other members of the Region. At future events, there will be opportunities for members to donate towards the cost of the commission.

NATIONAL RALLY AT STIRLING, 2023

Those of you who have attended National Rallies in the past will know that it includes a Concert, usually featuring teams from each region of HRGB. The Committee has been asked to put forward possible teams to represent the North West Region at Stirling, so this is a call to Team Correspondents.
